


Fireside Readers

UMCGR Endowment Fund NEWS

A wise spiritual director once said: "Every human being has two deaths:

The first is when you take your last earthly breath.

The second is the last time that anyone, anywhere, says your name out loud."

November offers two different opportunities to honor these two deaths.

- November 1 is All Saints Day. On Sunday, November 3 during worship, those who took their last earthly breath
 this past year will be named. You may contact the church office if you would like to include someone who is not
 a member of this congregation but has passed in the last 12 months and had been an important part of your life
 in that service.
- Thanksgiving is later in the month. As we pause to give thanks for the blessings that have surrounded us in this past year, also remember those who have gone before us to lead the way. Say their names out loud, either in the company of family or friends, or out on a walk in the woods, or in your devotional time, even driving in your car.

Both occasions are an opportunity for you to make a contribution in their memory to the Endowment Fund. (Write the check to UMCGR and write Endowment Fund in the memo line or give on line through Breeze).

Sometimes members of the Endowment Fund Committee are advised not to invite people to give money so often. But thankfully, many who are between the first and second deaths, who created the fund and invested in it, have sustained a Fund that has distributed over \$500,000 since it was started for the work of ministry.
